SECRETARY'S MESSAGE

Dear Students,

Even as AJK College of Arts and Science steps into the 8th year of its existence, I do realize that I have still quite a few dreams to be fulfilled and quite a few promises to keep.

In our relentless pursuit of quality and excellence, I am proud to point out that we have done quite a lot of hardwork. Our quest for NAAC accreditation within just seven years of the birth of the institution itself is quite creditable considering the fact that much older institutions have been hesitant to tread in that direction. I should admit it was a tough call, but it was a step in the right direction as it would definitely improve our quality through a cultured and streamlined format.

I am happy to note that the visit of the NAAC peer team in August 2014 was an ennobling andenlightening experience not only for the academic heads but also for the faculty and administrative members. The management was able to identify the areas that needed improvement and how they could be addressed.

Even as we secured 2.89 on a scale of 4, this exercise has strengthened our resolve to aspire for higher standards for which we have decided to rededicate ourselves with the co-operation of all the faculty members. Meanwhile, we have launched several laudable initiatives that would prove extremely beneficial to both the teaching and the learning community in the long run. One among them is the formation of an Internal Quality Assurance Cell to ensure not only the impeccable quality of the study material that we provide our students with each year but also to follow the entire academic exercise within the prescribed schedule. We have made the teacher himself a system.

Thus, the IQAC would look after the pattern of centralized question paper setting and centralized valuation. Through these two exercises, we are confident that not a modicum of misdemeanor could be perpetrated. Besides, the marks of the examinations- whether internal tests or the model examination-could be intimated to the parents within three days of conducting the examination. Thus, the parents would always be kept in the loop of the academic progress of their respective wards.

For the past few years, we have been providing free bus service to almost 98 per cent of our students hailing from various rural areas of Kerala. Some of them have got to traverse almost 120 - 140 km a day. But for the free bus facility, many of them might find it difficult to pursue their higher studies. We will continue to extend this facility this year. As an eco-friendly institution, we have been striving to make the campus totally green and provide a verdurous cover encompassing most parts of the institution. Despite several practical difficulties and severe financial constraints in this regard, we are determined to stick to our basic principle of being

Eco-friendly. The placement graph of the students has seen an upward climb each year with more than 1000 offers in the past year. This is also a very heartening achievement as several major organizations, industrial units and hotels have responded to our invitation and recruited quite a number of our students. We are focused on preparing our students in that area, particularly as it is an attribute which is found lacking in most institutions. As I already mentioned, some of our unfulfilled dreams include offering add-on courses. Similarly, extending additional hours for weak students and organizing remedial classes for them remain a concern. We hope to attend to these issues very soon.

The institution which started with a modest strength of 187 students and just half-a- dozen faculty members in 2007, has now reached a stage where it could be deemed to be a major college with over 2,000 students studying 17 UG and PG courses and also doing research in three major subjects. With the co-operation of the parents, students and, of course, our ever-smiling faculty members, we are confident of improving our institution not only in terms of numbers but also in quality. We admit that we have miles to go.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The college is affiliated to Bharathiar University and approved by Government of Tamil Nadu and UGC. The college got 2(f) and 12(B) status from the UGC. The college has been accredited by the NAAC, and IQAC has been formed.

- As an affiliated college, the syllabus of Bharathiar University for various courses has been adopted.
- Admissions are on the basis of marks and reservation policy of Government of Tamil Nadu. As a self-financed college, the entire expenditure is borne by the college only.
- The college committee is the highest body to control both academic affairs and administration of the college. The Managing Trustee is the Head of the Management.
- The Principal is the Academic Head and controls the academic administration with the help of Vice-Principal, HODs, Faculty members and office staff. The Principal is responsible for all the academic and administration control of the office.
- The following committees have been formed and the staff nominated by the Principal will help and monitor the students in their academic and personal problems in general.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- Apply through a prescribed form for each course.
- On the basis of selection committee's recommendation, the students are called for interview and committee selects the eligible candidates.
- Students shall submit all the original certificates to the office for verification.
- On showing these certificates, the college will get the approval of the admission from the university. The registered number allotted by the university will be the roll number of the students until he/she completes the course.
- For all admitted candidates, Free bus services will be provided.

DURING THE COURSE

- All first year students have to attend the orientation programme arranged by the college.
- The information on various activities and procedures to be adopted will be given to each student.
- Time table and syllabus for the course will be distributed to the students.
- For every 25/30 students, one tutor will be nominated by the HOD. He/She will be the in charge of the batch. He/She will take care of the boys/girls in all academic matters.

Payment Of Semester Fees:

The students have to pay their tuition fees / semester fees twice a year , in the month of March and October. The details regarding payment of semester fees will be put up on the notice board in advance. The students are requested to refer to the notice board and pay the fees on time.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The college will provide the academic calendar in which the details of holidays, class tests, arrangements and other activities are given. In addition to this, important information will be circulated through departments. Students are advised to look up the notice board regularly.

A separate notice board exclusively for university information like dates of examinations, practical, and theory examinations, fees payment details, Re-valuation, Re-appearance details, etc., has been put up near the college office.

LIBRARY

There is a Library where educational video cassettes and CD-ROMs have been added to the main Library. Reprographic facilities and internet facilities are also available in the library. The library is kept open from 9.30 am. to 6.00 pm. on all working days. The Library is computerized. Bar coding system has been introduced.

Books will be issued to the students on production of their ID cards. The students have freedom to use the books for a week. On receipt of the book, the students should examine the books and report at once the damage, if any, seen in the book. Failure to return the books on time will entail a fine of Rs.1/- per day/ book.

If the student has lost the book he/she has to pay the cost of the book as informed by the librarian. At the end of every semester, the students have to return their library books and get a 'no dues' certificate.

PLACEMENT CELL

To help the students to get job "Placement Cell "has been established in the college. The students are requested to contact the faculty members of the placement cell for further details. Placement cell will arrange meetings, interviews and conduct the training programs for the placement.

The students have to register their names and attend the programs without fail. Only registered candidates will be permitted to attend the placement.

CO – CURRICULAR/EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

To promote leadership activities and organizing abilities, various subject Associations have been established. NSS units are also helping students to participate in various extension activities.

The college concentrates on extra – curricular activities of the students. Physical director will take care of the sports activities. There are separate play grounds for Football, Hockey, Cricket, Basket Ball and Kabadi.

The Language Departments have the responsibility to conduct cultural activities, competitions and inter-collegiate events every year. In addition to this, there are various events to celebrate State and National functions.

TRANSPORT

Free bus facilities are provided by the management to all students to attend the college. Attendance will be taken by the faculty everyday in the morning and evening at campus.

HOSTEL

Separate hostels for Men and Women students are available. Principal will be the WARDEN for all the hostels and a Residential Deputy Warden will be nominated by the Principal. Separate Rules and Regulations will be given to the inmates of the hostel.

IDENTITY CARD (ID CARD)

A Photographic Identity Card incorporating the student's Registration Number will be issued to the students. The students must carry their identity card at all times and they may be required to produce the card for

RULES AND REGULATIONS

For the attention of the students:

- You are now in AJK CAS; you are one of the stake-holders of the institution.
- You have the responsibility to abide by the rules and regulations in three sections, they are....
- i) For your personal behavior ii) for your academic area iii) for the general administration.

(i) CODE OF CONDUCT

- All students are expected to attend the college neatly dressed maintaining decorum. Men students should wear full pants with shirt neatly tucked in. T- shirt and other fancy shirts are prohibited inside the campus.
- Women students shall attend the college wearing sarees or salwar kameez with duppata only.
- Every student is provided with an identity card. All students should wear their ID card along with tag. Otherwise, they will not be permitted inside the class.
- The property of the college has to be maintained properly. Any damage, in any form, will be seriously dealt with.
- The students are forbidden from writing/ scribbling/ painting on the walls and desks.
- Smoking is prohibited in the campus.
- Students found using drugs or liquor will be dismissed from the college.
- Students are banned from participating in political or communal activities.
- Eve teasing and Ragging are offences with punishment which might result in imprisonment. (For other details refer to page no:18 of this Handbook)
- Students should not sit on the parapet walls / on the steps/ staircase.
- Use of MOBILE PHONE IS BANNED in the campus.

Bus rules:

- Bus safety depends upon the students' co-operation with the driver.
- The driver has to accord his full attention to the road. Hence the students should have selfdiscipline.
- The students should follow the code of conduct for the bus.
- The students must remain seated.
- The students must follow the directions of the bus driver and the staff member.
- The students will not be permitted to travel by a bus other than the one assigned.
- No other person except our college students is permitted to travel by the college bus.
- All the students should have their identification card. Without that card, no student will be permitted to board the bus.
- Misbehaiour at the boarding point, within the bus / outside the bus will be dealt with severely.
- Ragging is prohibited. It is an offence. It is a crime, and strict disciplinary action will be taken as per law.
- Violation of college rules while commuting by the bus or causing any trouble might result in the loss of the free bus privilege.
- Once you have boarded the bus, you will not be permitted to get down midway.

- Bus timings and schedule will be announced by the principal.
- Shouting in the bus and teasing the public are strictly prohibited. Violation may lead to disciplinary action.
- Please remember that any one who is punished for violation of rules and regulations of the college / college bus will permanently lose the free bus facility.

(ii) ACADEMIC

As an affiliated college, it has adopted the regulations of the parent University for all academic matters.

CURRICULUM/ PROGRAMME OF STUDY

Curriculum : Every Department has a prescribed course which in, general terms, is known as curriculum/course of study/programme.It prescribes courses to be studied in each semester. The Departments will give you the details of each semester. However, you have to verify with Bharathiar University website (www.b-uac.in) for your programme.

Semester : There are two semesters in a year. The semester that begins in June (June to November) is known as odd semester and the semester that begins in December (December to April) is known as even semester.

Examination : Bharathiar University Rules and Regulations are applicable to the examinations. A copy has been placed on the Notice Board for reference of the students.

Evaluation : The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been introduced. Scheme of Examination under CBCS pattern will be given to each student by the Department at the beginning of the semester.

As per the norms of the University, in general, each paper (course) has 25:75 pattern for UG and PG programmes. (25 marks as continuous Internal Assessment mark (CIA) and 75 marks as End semester University Examination).Internal and End Semester Examination Marks put together the students at UG level have to score 40 Marks and at PG level have to score 50 Marks out of 100 to pass the Examination.

Students Internal Test and Model Examination Marks will be sent to the parents for their information. Under CIA system, the student is continuously assessed by the concerned faculty members through periodical test and assignment.

Attendance : The Guidelines of Attendance requirement issued by the Bharathiar University is adopted by this College. Attendance shall be considered Semester-wise.

A candidate will be permitted to appear for the Comprehensive Examination (End Semester) in any semester if

- He/ she secures not less than 75% of attendance in the total number of working days during the semester.
- His/ Her progress / conduct has been satisfactory.
- If the absence of a student in a semester exceeds 22 ½ days, he/she will not be permitted to write the semester examination.
- Minimum working days for a semester will be 90.

Important : If a student is absent for one or more hours in a session (morning session between 10:00 to 1:00 and afternoon session 1:30 to 3:30), he/she will lose attendance for half a day. For example, a candidate has attended the first hour and absented himself/herself in the second hour, he/she will lose half-a-day has attended.

A student will be given only one opportunity to carry forward the deficiency in attendance to the next semester during the period of study of any degree course, failing which he/she will have to be readmitted.

"A STUDENT WITH LESS THAN 50% OF ATTENDANCE IN ANY SEMESTER WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CONTINUE HIS/HER STUDY IN THE SUBSEQUENT SEMESTER .SUCH STUDENTS WILL BE ASKED TO REJOIN THE SEMESTER IN WHICH THE ATTENDANCE WAS LESS THAN 50%".

CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

Undergraduates : Candidates who have passed part I Languages

(Tamil/ Hindi/ French / Malayalam) and other courses approved and secured

(i) 60 percent and above and (ii) 50 percent and above but below 60 percent

in the examinations prescribed for the programme in the various semesters and within THREE YEARS from the date of admission, shall be declared to have passed their examinations in First Class and second class respectively. All other successful candidates shall be declared to have passed the examinations prescribed for ENGLISH shall be declared to have passed ENGLISH in First, Second and Third class. Candidates who have passed all the part III examinations in FIRST ATTEMPT within his/her study period of three years in UG securing 90% and above 75% to 89.99% in aggregate of part III shall be declared to have passed in part III Examinations of UG in FIRST CLASS WITH OUTSTANDING and FIRST CLASS WITH DISTINCTION respectively.

Candidates who passed the subjects of part III Examinations in various programmes securing

- 60 percent and above and
- 50 percent and above but below 60 percent

in the Examinations for the Programmes in various semesters and within 5 years from the date of admission shall be declared to have passed the Examination in I Class and II Class respectively.

Postgraduates : Candidates who have passed all the subjects of examination in FIRST ATTEMPT within his/her study period for the programme and securing 90% above and 75% to 89.99% in aggregate marks shall be declared to have passed the Examination in FIRST CLASS WITH OUTSTANDING and FIRST CLASS WITH DISTINCTION. Candidates who have passed the subjects of examinations in various programmes shall be declared to have passed in FIRST CLASS & SECOND CLASS respectively if they had scored 60% and above and 50% and above respectively.

Re-Totalling : Candidates who are desirous of having their answer books re-totalled shall apply to the Controller of Examinations in the prescribed form. Application forms can be obtained from the college. Mode of payment may be either Demand Draft of any bank or general fund account from Bank of India of selected branches. The payment through DD should be drawn in favour of "The Registrar, Bharathiar University, payable at Coimbatore".

Re-Valuation : The request for Revaluation should be sent in prescribed application form through the envelope within twelve (12) days from the date of publication of result. A Demand Draft for Rs.325/- per paper drawn in favour of "The Registrar, Bharathiar University, payable at Coimbatore" – must be sent along with the application.

Examination : All tests will be conducted only on prior notice. All tests will be conducted as per the schedule announced by the HOD/PRINCIPAL. The class teacher shall intimate CIA marks of the candidate and his/her attendance details to their parents through post. Mark list will also be displayed on the notice board. END Semester Examination of three hours duration will be conducted by the University Controller of Examinations (COE).

Passing Minimum : The CIA marks for 25 will be sent to the COE's office from the college. The COE will conduct end semester Examination for 75 marks for the course papers. The course (paper) will have CIA and ESE on 25:75. A candidate has to score minimum 40% in ESE and should have 40 marks out of total 100. There is no minimum mark to be scored for the internal.

RAGGING IS AN OFFENCE

Ragging is a crime and Strict Disciplinary action will be taken as per the guidelines issued by the UGC/ Bharathiar University/Government of Tamil Nadu.
